Overall purpose of the role:

Creating and maintaining relationships with our high value donors, developing a strong pipeline of prospect donors for future sustainable growth. Driving strategic partnerships within our Charity's operational and clinical team to promote its objective to major donors. Working closely with the Head of High Value Giving and supporting the Stewardship co-ordinator.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- Working directly with the Head of High Value Giving, Ambassadors and members of the executive and clinical team this role is key to the success of the increase in the income within the team and the need to work independently and be a self-motivator is important.
- Working with current donor data, research warm prospects developing a prospect pipeline to cultivation strategy to convert to high value donors. Create cultivation plans for prospects and donors.
- Manage and develop a portfolio of prospects and supporters to deliver major gifts.
- Implement a research strategy to identify cold prospects within the region and beyond to identify a prospect pipeline for cultivation, working closely with all key stakeholders and the Stewardship co-ordinator to achieve success.
- Developing and delivering a donor solicitation strategy for all major gift prospects.
- Designing and operating a donor stewardship program for all existing major donors with the support of the stewardship co-ordinator.
- Ensure accurate tracking and assessing major gift fundraising metrics. Detailing all ongoing duties on the Charity's CRM noting more specific tasks and daily routines your major gift fundraiser role.
- Drafting major gift proposal documents to reflect the potential bespoke projects available for support, this will require close liaison with the Operational and Clinical teams.
- Using major giving fundraising and marketing tools, to deliver timely and relevant materials for the stewardship of High Value Giving Donors.
- Managing and updating the Charity's project list, working with colleagues to establish annual and multi-year income targets and activity plan.
- Manage and drive the activity of the Stewardship -Co-ordinator, identifying measurable outputs .
