

So why do I support the North West Air Ambulance Charity? Well, in May 2000, I was involved in a serious car crash on my way to work. The fire service was needed to release me from the car, where I was trapped for 45 minutes. Suffering severe leg injuries, I needed to get to an appropriate hospital as soon as possible. The NWAA crew quickly arrived on scene, airlifting me to hospital. Without NWAA, I may not have survived.

Since the accident, I have spent time volunteering for NWAA as a way of saying thank you. I deliver presentations to share my story and show just how important this charity is. Volunteering allows me to give back to the people who saved my life.

Eimhear's Sponge Cake

- 1. Preheat your oven to 190c / 170c fan / gas 5 and grease 2 sandwich tins.
- 2. While the oven is heating up mix the butter, caster sugar and vanilla extract together in a bowl until the mix is smooth.
- 3. Add in the 4 eggs, one at a time, and fold the flour until the ingredients are fully
- 4. Split the mix evenly between the two pregreased tins. Place both tins into the oven for 20 minutes, or until risen and golden
- 5. Once removed from the oven leave to cool for around 5 minutes. Remove the cakes from the tins and allow to cool on a rack.

6. Once completely cooled add the whipped cream and jam to one of the halves and place the other on top. Dust the cake with icing sugar to finish.



Ingredients:

- 250g softened butter, plus extra for greasing
- · 250g self raising flour
- · 250g caster sugar
- · 4 medium eggs
- 1 tbs vanilla extract

Filling:

 Whipped cream, strawberry/ raspberry jam and icing sugar

Helen's Coronation Chicken

- 1. Add shredded chicken to a large bowl with the mayonnaise and Greek yogurt.
- 2. Add the curry powder, cinnamon and mango chutney and season to taste, give this all a good stir until mixed through. Ensure the chicken is well coated.
- 3. Add the sultanas and fold into the mix.
- 4. Garnish with coriander and serve any way you like or as per suggestions below.

Serving suggestions:

Serve as a sandwich with some leafy or crunchy lettuce or mixed in with pasta. This could also be served in a baked potato with a side salad or in a flat bread with some salad garnish.

If vou're veggie or vegan why not swap the mayonnaise, Greek yogurt, and chicken for plant-based alternatives!

Ingredients:

- 8 tbsp mayonnaise
- 1 tbsp Greek yogurt
- 4 tsp mild curry powder (this can be adjusted to taste. To increase the heat, you could use a hot or madras curry powder)
- 1 tsp lemon juice (optional)
- ½ tsp ground cinnamon
- · 2-3 tbsp mango chutney
- 2 tbsp sultanas or apricots (depending on taste)
- · Salt & pepper
- 600g cooked shredded chicken

Meet our Fundraisers



Daniel McLoughlin

A tree surgeon from Preston who was treated by the North West Air Ambulance Charity is hoping to raise £3,500, after a 'lucky escape' in a freak chainsaw accident.

32-year-old Daniel McLoughlin was working up a tree in June 2017, when the chainsaw he was using to cut branches hit his chest. Now five years on from the accident, Daniel is taking part in the Great Manchester Run half-marathon to raise vital funds for the charity.

Daniel said: "I was working up a tree cutting a branch with the chainsaw. I was in an awkward position and as I cut through, the branch kicked the chainsaw back into my chest."

Daniel was given pain relief at scene and transferred to Blackpool Royal Hospital where a team treated his injuries.



"It's a worthy cause and I want to raise the same amount as an average flight would cost."

"I was really lucky. The chainsaw hit me in my sternum and missed everything vital. If it was my neck or anywhere else I would probably be dead.

"I was awake on the helicopter and the staff were really calm. It was the first time I'd been in a helicopter, I couldn't lie back because of the nature of my injury, so I saw my house as we flew over!

"it's great what the air ambulance do, and I found out the charity doesn't receive any funding, so I just wanted to give something back. It's a worthy cause and I want to raise the same amount as an average flight would cost."





Corinne Mason

Six years after a horrific accident, mum of three Corinne Mason has successfully taken on her first marathon as a thank you to the charity for saving her son's life.

Corinne's son Fred was saved by the North West Air Ambulance Charity in April 2016 after a road traffic collision following a diesel spill on the motorway they were travelling on.

The family had pulled over to the hard shoulder because of the treacherous conditions and as Fred exited the car, another vehicle skidded on the road. The out-of-control vehicle hit the family's car and Fred, who was only five years old at the time of the incident, was thrown into the air before landing on the hard shoulder.

Fred was airlifted to Alder Hey Children's Hospital in a matter of minutes with a serious head injury. Nicknamed the 'boy of steel' by staff, he was out of hospital within a week.

Eight years on, Fred is now a healthy and happy 11-year-old and preparing to start secondary school this year.

Ever since the accident, the Mason family have fundraised regularly for the charity. In April 2022, Corinne took on her first ever marathon and smashed her fundraising target, raising a fantastic £1,250 for the charity. Collectively the family have raised over £4,000.

Corinne said: "The marathon is probably the biggest fundraiser we have done. But I absolutely loved the challenge. To do the full distance is amazing... and absolutely knackering!

"The money we've raised doesn't seem like a lot, but if you manage to save a life or if the charity makes a difference to someone's outcome, then that's massive.

"Fred is a very healthy, normal boy now. We're super, super lucky. But for a certain amount of time in April 2016 we thought we'd lost him and if the air ambulance wasn't there I believe we would have."

Volunteers' Week 01-07 June 2022

Every year from the 1st to the 7th of June, organisations and charities all around the country celebrate the selfless contributions of millions of incredible volunteers, working hard to make a difference in their communities.

This year, we are honoured to share our Volunteers' Week with the Queen's Jubilee Celebrations. Just as the Queen recognises the efforts of outstanding individuals in her New Year's honours list, we'd like to spend some time looking at the outstanding efforts of our volunteers and everything they have helped us achieve over the last 12 months.

Our retail volunteers have processed over 80,000 bags of donated items in the last year, and every hour a volunteer spends in a retail role can generate £90 through retail sales.

Whilst we know our volunteers are invaluable, the difference they make is truly astounding. Despite a limited calendar of events over the last year, our fundraising volunteers, namely speakers, tin collectors, and event volunteers, have helped to raise over half a million pounds, with £67,000 raised by our dedicated tin collection team.





In the News



A long standing North West Air **Ambulance Charity volunteer and** fundraiser has been recognised for years of dedicated service to the charity.

Freda Whittle was nominated for Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council's Community Volunteer of the Year by NWAA colleagues.

Across nearly 15 years, Freda has worked tirelessly to raise funds and encourage others to raise money in several different roles. In total. Freda has raised an incredible £117,000 during her time with the charity, but has encouraged so many more to raise funds and awareness.

Staff at the charity wanted to recognise her work and surprised Freda with a bouquet of flowers, and presented her certificate of recognition at the charity's Barrowford shop where Freda works.

Speaking about her time volunteering for NWAA. Freda said: "North West Air Ambulance Charity is such a worthwhile charity. I have a friend whose daughter wouldn't be here if it wasn't for the air ambulance"

"It's nice to be nominated, but it is recognition to the charity as well, which I think is more important."



Blackpool Council has donated £15,000 to the North West Air **Ambulance Charity**

Blackpool Council has donated £15.000 to the North West Air Ambulance Charity service as part of a national crematorium metal recycling scheme.

The cheque was presented to the North West Air Ambulance Charity by Councillor Neal Brookes, Blackpool Council's Cabinet Member responsible for cemeteries and the crematorium, on behalf of the Institute of Cemetery and Crematorium Management (ICCM).

The charitable Metal Recycling Scheme run by the ICCM, involves the sale of recycled metal materials recovered following cremations, such as hip and knee replacements.

In the past, this metal was removed and buried in the grounds of the crematorium but this became less acceptable on environmental grounds.

Families give their permission for the residual metals to be recycled via the nationally recognised scheme. Proceeds are shared between members such as Blackpool Council to donate to a charity of their choice.
