I owe so much to the North **West Air Ambulance Charity** ⁹⁹

Alice's Story

When Alice Roberts was just 14, an accident left her fighting for her life. Now 29, she reflects on that life-changing day - and how NWAA helped her get here.

66 It was September 2010, and I was looking after a horse when suddenly it bolted onto a main road. I hung on, trying to stop him, but we were hit by a Land Rover, and the horse fell on top of me. I don't remember any of it, thankfully.

The local farmer came to help; he opened my airway and called 999. The air ambulance landed in a field next to the road, but they had to move all the cows first. Apparently, cows like helicopters, which is funny to think about now.99



Alice sustained lifethreatening injuries, including multiple breaks and fractures, a ruptured diaphragm, as well as damage to her liver and spleen. Because of this, we airlifted her to Royal Preston Hospital.

66 My parents were told to get anvone there who wanted to say goodbye. It's surreal hearing that now, but somehow, I made it through.

I was then transferred to Manchester Children's Hospital. When I first arrived, they weren't sure I would survive. There was also a query over whether I had a head injury, and I was kept on a ventilator for the first few days. 99

Alice had two big surgeries and spent two weeks in intensive care. She's gone on to make a fantastic recovery, with the incident influencing her career path.

66 I was under eight different consultant teams, and I found it fascinating. I didn't know most of those medical specialities existed. I think that curiosity helped me cope; I just wanted to understand what they were doing.

When I went to university, I studied Clinical Sciences and then went on to complete a Master's degree in Human Anatomy at Edinburgh. I'm now a Lecturer in Anatomy at Sunderland University. teaching medical and healthcare students. I absolutely love it.99



Last New Year's Eve, I rang in 2025 on the night car. Just before midnight, we were called to a patient, and as the clock struck twelve, we were by their side, doing everything we could to give them the best chance of survival.
